Tech Fest

On Saturday, February 26th 2011, MFESTS worked closely with The Works Museum in Edina to coordinate volunteers for Eweek Tech Fest Saturday, supplying 25 volunteers from MFESTS societies for experiment support of Electrical, Mechanical, Civil and Aerospace experiment rooms. The Works is a hands-on museum of engineering and technology that is geared toward elementary school age children. Tech Fest is an event held at The Works on the Saturday after Engineers Week. In 2011, over 1,500 kids attended Tech Fest with their parents.

Future Cities Competition

MFESTS presented its 7th annual “Engineering Excellence” Special Award at the Regional Future Cities Competition at held on Saturday, January 15th 2011 at Keller Hall (EE & CSCI building) on the University of Minnesota Minneapolis. There were 25 teams. Four MFESTS society judges: Cassie Svedson (SWE), Mark Feitel (INCOSE), Tracy Gillis (ASCE) and Peter Baker (ISA) judged along with coordinator Kurt Nordstrom (MFESTS). Friendly Hills Middle School Mendota Heights – with their city of Skye Valley (our 1st choice) won our special award that recognized the team with the most comprehensive use of all of the engineering disciplines. MFESTS supplied certificates and very nice gift bags for the winning team. MFESTS also provided financial support of \$500.00 to which qualified as a Bronze Sponsor of the Future Cities program.
